Captain Paul Yep's Message

Our Central Station "Street Crimes Unit" (plain clothes team) have been very active and tremendously successful apprehending auto burglars in the Central Police District. The team has made 112 arrests since April this year alone!

Here are some auto burglary prevention tips straight from Sergeant Steven Spagnuolo, the Team Leader:

- Auto Burglary suspects will often drop one or two people off to case vehicles to burglarize while the driver remains in the car.
- Auto Burglary suspects will lean up against a vehicle to use their body to shield them breaking the window from possible witnesses.
- Auto Burglary suspects will use hooded sweatshirts or masks to hide their faces from witnesses.
- Auto Burglary suspects will use flashlights or lights on their mobile devices to illuminate the inside of vehicles at night.

If you witness an auto burglary, try to get the license plate of suspect vehicle, and if possible and safe to do so, take photo or video using your personal mobile device.

Preventative Measures:

- Do not leave valuables in plain sight in your vehicle.
- Do not leave backpacks, purses, or bags of any type in plain sight in your vehicle. (Thieves will break into your vehicle on the chance there is something valuable in the bag.)
- Do not leave power cords sticking out of your center console. It gives the impression you left a phone or device charging in there.

Finally,

Don't second guess yourself, if a person or vehicle seems out of place, or seems fishy to you, call the police. It's worth the call. Your help is invaluable to us.



Incidents of Note

Possession of Stolen Cell Phone/Resisting Arrest/Warrant Arrest – 400 BLK of Market Street – 08/08/17, 17:04

Officers responded to a call of a stolen cellphone from a commercial office. Officers arrived on scene and saw the suspect leaving the front door of the office. The suspect ran and officers gave pursuit. Officers detained the suspect after the suspect resisted arrest. Officers investigating the crime interviewed the victim of the stolen cell phone and she used “find my cell phone” to send a ring tone alert on her phone. The victim’s stolen cell phone was found ringing in the suspect’s pant pocket. The suspect was taken into custody.



Criminal Threats/Trespassing – 300 BLK of Market Street – 08/08/17, 14:50

The suspect was standing in front of a bank holding a metal pipe in front of 333 Market Street. The suspect was agitated and angry while clinching his fists. A security guard for the bank approached the suspect and asked him leave the property. The suspect threatened to hit the security guard with the metal pipe. Officers arrived on scene and arrested the suspect.

Aggravated Assault/Vandalism/Battery – 400 BLK of Grant Avenue – 08/09/17, 18:31

Officers responded to a 911 call regarding a person with a knife inside a business. The suspect damaged antiques, brandished a pair of scissors, pushed the victim, and also exposed his privates to the victim inside the business as he was leaving the store. Officers arrived and arrested the suspect.

Plain clothes officers were conducting vehicle burglary abatement in the Fisherman's Wharf area. Officers observed a suspect break a vehicle's window and steal a backpack. Officers arrested the suspect after witnessing the crime. Officers also arrested a second suspect who was waiting in a vehicle. Officers found burglary tools and an operating police scanner via a cellular phone app in the suspect's possessions.

The victim's door was open and the suspect entered the apartment. The suspect stole the victim's tablet and numerous personal items. The victim saw the suspect on his porch with his stolen items in plain sight. The victim detained the suspect until officers arrived and arrested the suspect. Officers then searched suspect and located narcotic paraphernalia. Officers also found a no bail burglary warrant for the suspect.

The victim told officers that no one had permission to be in her apartment. The suspect barricaded himself inside the victim's apartment and did not answer the door. Officers forced entry and arrested the suspect. A search of the suspect by officers found stolen property from three victims not related to the apartment's residents. Furthermore, officer's found methamphetamine and paraphernalia belonging to the suspect.
