Captain Paul Yep's Message

Central Officers recently arrested a suspect involved in a commercial burglary series.

On August 24, 2018, Central Station officers responded to a burglary call at 225 Bush Street, a large retail commercial establishment. A witness reported that a suspect was pulling on an emergency-exit door. The glass on the door was missing. The witness provided a thorough description of the suspect. Officers located and detained a subject matching the suspect's description. The witness positively identified the suspect for the officers.

Central Station Officers had previously responded to other burglaries with similar modus operandi (MO), where the glass on commercial properties had been removed in a similar fashion. Officers viewed the surveillance footage of the other burglaries. They were able to identify the same suspect and tied him into the other burglaries. Through the investigation the suspect was charged in connection with seven separate burglaries!!!

The suspect had prior arrests using similar MO in multiple different Police Districts in San Francisco. An example of the great work done by your Central Station officers.

Burglary (Commercial and Residential)

Burglary – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

8/13	4:55am	Burglary, Commercial 1100 BLK of Battery	An unknown suspect shattered the office window and entered the office. It is unknown if the suspect stole any property.

Aggravated Assault

Assault – An unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

8/17	12:17am	Aggravated Assault, With Gun 1200 BLK of California	The two victims agreed to a price for services with an unknown suspect. As the victims made a turn in their vehicle, the suspect fired gunshots at them. The suspect then fled the scene.
8/18	9:19pm	Aggravated Assault, With Force 2700 BLK of Taylor	The victim was in a verbal argument with two unknown suspects and the suspects began to push the victim. The suspects then punched the victim and he fell to the ground. The suspects continued to punch and kick the victim until witnesses broke up the fight. The suspects then fled the scene.
8/20	1:30am	Aggravated Assault, With Other Weapon Larkin/Pine	An unknown suspect was hitting parking meters with a metal pole. The victim confronted the suspect and the suspect yelled at the victim. The victim took out his cell phone and took a picture of the suspect. The suspect raised the metal pole and chased the victim. The suspect struck the victim in the back with the pole. The suspect then fled the scene.
8/24	12:50pm	Aggravated Assault, With Other Weapon 2300 BLK of Hyde	The victims were walking back to their vehicle when they noticed a suspect vehicle driving away from their vehicle that had been broken into. The suspect drove away at a high rate of speed towards another victim doing traffic control, who had to jump out of the way.
9/1	5:30pm	Aggravated Assault, With Force 1300 BLK of Washington	The victim was engaged in a verbal altercation with an unknown suspect. The suspect then grabbed the victim around her throat with his hands. The suspect then pushed the victim down the staircase. The suspect then fled the scene.

Robbery

Robbery – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

8/13	2:30pm	Robbery, With Force Spofford/Washington	Three unknown suspects approached the victim and stole her cell phone. The suspects fled and the victim chased after them. The victim grabbed one of the suspects by the arm. The suspect punched her in the head and the suspects then fled the scene.
8/14	3:00pm	Robbery, Commercial, With Force 100 BLK of Powell	The suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. The suspect was confronted by security outside of the store. The suspect attempted to hit and kick security while being detained. Officers arrived on scene and arrested the suspect. Arrest made.
8/14	10:38pm	Robbery, With Force Hyde/Union	An unknown suspect grabbed the victim from behind and forced her to the ground. The suspect forced the cell phone from the victim's hand and fled into a waiting vehicle.
8/18	12:30am	Robbery, With Knife Kearny/Pacific	An unknown suspect approached the victim after the victim withdrew money from the ATM. The suspect pointed a knife at the victim and demanded his property. Fearing for his safety, the victim gave the suspect his property. The suspect then fled the scene.
8/18	5:00am	Robbery, With Other Weapon Sutter/Hyde	The victim heard her vehicle alarm and went to investigate. An unknown suspect stepped out from behind her vehicle and threw a bicycle at her. The suspect then grabbed the victim's wallet from her hand. The suspect rummaged through the victim's vehicle before fleeing the scene.
8/18	7:00pm	Robbery, Commercial, With Weapon Unit BLK of Powell	Six unknown suspects entered the store. One of the suspects held a stun gun in the air and activated it to prevent the employees from intervening as the suspects stole from the store. The suspects stole merchandise and then fled the scene.
8/21	1:30pm	Robbery, Commercial, With Force Embarcadero/Beach	The suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee followed the suspect out of the store. The suspect threatened to harm the employee if he continued to follow. The suspect then punched the employee in the face. With the help of Pier 39 security, they located the suspect and detained him. Arrest made.

8/22	11:40am	Robbery, Commercial, With Force Unit BLK of O'Farrell	An unknown suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. Security confronted the suspect at the door and a physical struggle ensued. The suspect was able to put security in the headlock. After security was able to break free from the suspect's hold, the suspect fled the scene.
8/23	1:30am	Robbery, Attempt, With Force 700 BLK of Larkin	An unknown suspect rode his motorcycle up to the victim and grabbed the victim's cell phone from his hand. After a brief struggle, the suspect was able to rip the phone away from the victim. The suspect then fled the scene.
8/24	8:30pm	Robbery, With Gun 600 BLK of Montgomery	Three unknown suspects approached the victim and one of them pointed a gun at the victim. The suspects demanded the victim's property. The victim gave the suspects his backpack. The suspects then fled the scene.
8/24	9:30pm	Robbery, With Gun Unit BLK of Geary	Three unknown suspects surrounded the victim and one of them pointed a gun at her. One of the suspects tried to pull the victim's cell phone from her hand, but the victim held onto the phone. One of the suspects struck her with the gun and the victim released her phone. The suspects grabbed the victim's purse before fleeing the scene.
8/26	8:45pm	Robbery, With Force 3000 BLK of Polk	An unknown suspect trespassed into the business and was told to leave multiple times. When the victim took out her cell phone to call the police, the suspect grabbed the phone and a struggle ensued. The suspect attempted to punch the victim in the face and eventually ripped the phone out of her hand. The suspect then fled the scene.
8/26	9:45pm	Robbery, Attempt, With Force Columbus/Union	Four suspects approached a victim and pulled her to the ground. The suspects punched and kicked the victim while trying to steal her property from her pockets. A witness came to assist the victim and the suspects fled the scene. The four suspects then approached a second victim and pulled her to the ground. The suspects punched and kicked the second victim while trying to steal her purse and phone. As officers were responding to the first incident, they observed the second incident and took the suspects into custody. Arrest made.
8/28	2:56pm	Robbery, Commercial, With Knife 500 BLK of Geary	An unknown suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee confronted the suspect at the door. The suspect attempted to leave, but the employee grabbed her by the arm. The suspect reached into her bag and pulled out a knife. Fearing for his safety, the employee stepped away from the suspect. The suspect then fled the scene.
8/28	9:30pm	Robbery, With Gun 100 BLK of Post	Two unknown suspects approached the victim from behind and punched him in the head. The suspects pinned the victim against the building and pointed a gun to his stomach. The suspects demanded the victim's property. Fearing for his safety, the victim gave the suspects his property. The suspects then fled the scene.
8/29	12:45am	Robbery, With Force Burritt/Bush	The victim was talking on his cell phone when an unknown suspect parked his vehicle in front of the victim at the curb. The suspect approached the victim and demanded the victim's cell phone. The victim refused to give the suspect his phone. The suspect grabbed and attempted to pull the cell phone from the victim. The suspect then punched the victim in the stomach. The victim let go of his phone. The suspect then fled away in his vehicle.
8/29	5:10pm	Robbery, Commercial, With Knife Unit BLK of Jefferson	An unknown suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee confronted the suspect at the door. A struggle ensued for the merchandise. The suspect was holding a folding blade in his hand during the struggle. The employee was cut by the blade. The suspect then fled the scene.
8/29	8:08pm	Robbery, With Force Geary/Stockton	An unknown suspect struck the victim's arm and grabbed the victim's cell phone from her hands. The suspect then fled the scene.

8/30	2:15pm	Robbery, With Force New Montgomery/ Market	Two unknown suspects approached the victim and hit her hand causing her to drop her cell phone. The suspects picked up the phone and fled the scene.
8/30	9:00pm	Robbery, With Gun Leidesdorff/Pine	An unknown suspect tapped the victim on the back. When the victim turned around, the suspect was holding a gun which was pointed at the victim. The suspect was also accompanied by two other suspects. The suspects demanded his property. The suspects reached into the victim's pockets and stole his property. The suspects then fled the scene.
8/31	12:30pm	Robbery, With Gun Bush/Hyde	An unknown suspect approached the victim and pointed a gun at the victim's side. The suspect demanded for the victim's bag or he would shoot the victim. The victim gave the suspect his bag and the suspect fled the scene.
8/31	9:00pm	Robbery, With Gun Merchant/Battery	The three suspects approached the two victims from behind. One of the suspects pointed a gun at the victims and demanded their property. The victims refused to give them their property. The suspects then threatened to shoot them. Fearing for their safety, one of the victims pulled out her cell phone. The suspects grabbed the cell phone and fled the scene. Officers arrived on scene and the victims were tracking the stolen cell phone to the 1100 BLK of Market. Officers in the area responded to the 1100 BLK of Market and found the suspects matching the descriptions provided by the victims. The victims positively identified the suspects. Arrest made.
9/1	2:45pm	Robbery, Commercial, With Force 1000 BLK of Hyde	The suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. An employee confronted the suspect outside of the store. A struggle ensued for the item. The employee was eventually successfully in retrieving the item from the suspect. The suspect stayed on scene and was arrested by police. Arrest made.
9/1	9:22pm	Robbery, Commercial, With Force Unit BLK of Stockton	Two unknown suspects entered the store and stole merchandise. Security confronted the suspects at the door. Security grabbed the bag with the stolen items from the suspects. The suspects ripped the bag from Security's grip and fled the scene.
9/2	12:12am	Robbery, Commercial, With Other Weapon 100 BLK of Powell	Two unknown suspects entered the store and stole merchandise. When security confronted the suspects, one of the suspects pushed him from behind and the other suspect sprayed pepper spray at him. The suspects then fled the scene.
9/2	8:40pm	Robbery, Commercial, With Force Unit BLK of Stockton	An unknown suspect entered the store and stole merchandise. The suspect was confronted by security at the door. The suspect pushed security outside of the store. The suspect then fled the scene.







Incidents of Note

Burglary, Vehicle

8/14/18 1619 hrs

Chestnut and Sansome Streets

On 8/14/18, plainclothes officers observed a vehicle casing parked cars on the 2300 block of Leavenworth Street. Officers observed the occupants of the vehicle burglarize a parked vehicle and flee the scene. Officers lost the vehicle in the area but broadcast the description. The officers located the same vehicle in the area of Chestnut and Sansome Streets and observed the suspects break into a second parked vehicle. Officers were able to follow the vehicle until it was stuck in traffic. Officers responded to the location and effected a traffic stop on the vehicle. The three occupants of the vehicle were taken into custody. Officers located victims for both boosted vehicles. "Cold shows" were conducted with positive results with witnesses who observed the boosting of the second vehicle. While at the scene with the suspect's vehicle, additional victim recognized her property and notified the officers that it belonged to her. The victim's responded to Central Station where they identified their property. All three suspects were booked at County Jail.

Burglary, Other Building, Forcible Entry

8/16/18 0634 hrs

1112 Jones Street

On 8/16/18, uniformed officers responded to Grace Cathedral on reports of a suspect breaking a door window to the building and leaving with stolen property. Officers located the Suspect in the area and placed him under arrest. Officers met with the witness who agreed to participate in a "cold show". The "cold show" was conducted with positive results. The Suspect was booked at County Jail.

Firearm, Discharging in Grossly Negligent Manner

8/17/18 2254 hrs

1100 Kearny Street

On 8/17/18, uniformed foot beat officers heard the sound of gunshots on Broadway Street. The officers did not locate any suspects or victims but did locate five spent cartridge casings in the area and observed a video camera that captured the incident. The officers were able to view the video and provided a suspect description for the incident. Approximately one hour later, uniformed officers in the area located the Suspect. The officers placed the suspect under arrest but were unable to locate the firearm. The Suspect's clothing, which matched the video of him firing rounds into the air was seized and booked. The suspect was booked at County Jail.

Robbery, Attempt, Street or Public, With Force; Assault, Aggravated, W/ Other Weapon

8/26/18 2145 hrs

Columbus Avenue and Union Streets

On 8/26/18, uniformed foot beat officers were enroute to reports of a robbery at Columbus Avenue and Union Street when they observed three subjects punching and kicking Victim #1. The officers detained the three subjects. The officers learned that the subjects grabbed Victim #1's hair and threw her to the ground. The subjects tried to pull Victim #1's cell phone and purse. The subjects kicked and punched Victim #1 and forcefully slammed her head onto the concrete. Victim #1 screamed and a witness came to assist her as officers arrived at the same time. The suspects were taken into custody.

The officers were informed of another victim who was attacked at Columbus and Union. Officers responded to Victim #2 and learned that she was also grabbed by the hair and forcefully pulled to the ground by the same subjects. The suspects punched and kicked Victim #2 while trying to steal her cell phone and money from her jacket pocket. Two witnesses came to assist her and the subjects fled the scene.

The suspects were positively identified by all the victims and witnesses. The suspects were booked at the Juvenile Justice Center.

Burglary, Vehicle

8/29/18 1945 hrs

The Embarcadero and Battery Street

On 8/29/18, plainclothes officers were conducting surveillance on two auto burglary suspects in the Embarcadero area. The officers observed suspects ride quickly away from a parked vehicle on bicycles and found that the vehicle had a shattered window. The officers caught up to the suspects and detained them. The officers recovered stolen property from the suspects as well as several burglary tools from them. The property was returned to the Victim. Both subjects were booked at County Jail.

Robbery, Street or Public Place, With Gun

8/31/18 2100 hrs

Merchant and Battery Streets

On 8/24/18, a robbery with a gun occurred in the Southern police district at 7:25pm. The victim had sustained minor injuries. On the same date, two separate robberies with a gun occurred in the Central police district within a short period of time. In each of the three robberies the suspects fled the area before police arrived on scene. Officers were able to obtain video from the third incident. A crime bulletin was issued regarding the incidents. On 8/31/18, uniformed officers responded to reports of a robbery with a gun. The officers arrived on scene and met with the victims who provided them with information to track the stolen cell phone. The suspects were located in the UN Plaza area and fled from police on foot. All three suspects were arrested in the area of UN Plaza. The stolen cell phone was recovered from one of the subjects. Officers recognized the suspects from the crime bulletin from the incidents on 8/24/18. All three suspects were booked at County Jail.


Officer Kunaboot was born at St. Mary's Hospital in San Francisco and his family owned a Thai restaurant for 22 years in the Ingleside District.

Definition of Suspicious Activity

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ◆ An individual peering into vehicles to locate any valuables left unattended.
- ◆ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/ or residence.
- ◆ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

Definition of Community Policing

Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

- Homeless Outreach and Outreach to Drug Users: Central Station officers coordinate with city agencies to provide outreach and assistance to rehabilitate those who are dependent on illegal drugs and outreach to homeless individuals to connect them with resources and support.
- Foot Patrols: Central Station have beat officers assigned to Union Square, Fisherman's Wharf, Chinatown, North Beach and Market/Drumm area.
- Monthly Police Community Relations Meetings: Community Meetings are held continuously. Officers also attend meetings with merchants groups, business groups, development authorities and others. Concerns are voiced and addressed through problem solving.
- Email Updates: Central Station sends out newsletter updates to residents in the District that alerts residents of crime trends, upcoming community events, crime prevention tips, and information on how to contact officers at the District Station.

Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Three Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

After clearing a basic background check you will be eligible to register for one of our triannual ALERT training classes as follows:

1. Complete two 8 hour classes with ALERT, or,
2. If you are already NERT Certified, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT, or,
3. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT.


